


Maidenhead Mencap Monday Club – this charity offers a wide range of activities for members of 19 years and over with learning disabilities, helping them to socialise and make friendships.




As part of the Flower & Produce Show at Cookham Dean in 2019 we are presenting an exhibition on the theme of 'Life On The River'.

FLOWER & PRODUCE SHOW COMPETITION RULES

Late entries will not be accepted.

No exhibitor will be allowed to enter more than one exhibit in a particular class. The name on the entry form should represent the person who has grown or made the entry.

Prize money will be paid on the show day between 3.00pm and 5.00pm. Cups will be presented in the Village Hall at 4.30pm

TOP TRAY RULES

The Top Tray class is for a collection of three types of vegetables taken from the following list of eight. The quantity of each vegetable required for the collection is given in brackets and each type must consist of the same variety: carrots (3), cauliflowers (2), onions (3), parsnips (2), page (6 page) potential.

peas (6 pods), potatoes (3), runner beans (6), tomatoes (6).

2. All vegetables are to be displayed for effect. The vegetables must be displayed within an area measuring 18" by 24" without bending any part of them. No part of any exhibit may exceed the size of the tray. A tray/ board measuring 18" by 24" can be used to display the vegetables, or simply mark the staging.

TOP VASE RULES

- 1. The Top Vase class is a vase of mixed flowering stems, containing a total of between 5 and 12 stems, taken from a minimum of 2 different kinds of plant.
- 2. A show vase must be used and will be provided on the day.
- 3. Only fresh home-grown flowers can be used in the vase. No dried or silk flowers are allowed.
- 4. The vase will be viewed from all directions. Judging of the flowers will use the same rules as other classes.

NOTES FOR EXHIBITORS and JUDGES

- 1. Vases and assistance are available on the morning of the show.
- 2. Exhibits are judged by RHS rules.
- 3. Carrots and parsnips should have foliage trimmed back to 3".
- 4. Peas and beans should be displayed with some stalk attached.
- 5. Tomatoes must be displayed with calyxes (the green flower bud case).
- 6. Flowering stems can be taken from any flowering plant.
- 7. Judges may handle exhibits to check quality.
